This officer had then taken care of her for the next couple of hours, when he didn't do his job right in the first place.

Strike two had begun when she had refused treatment at the hospital, or a hospital visit all together. Here, the officer – as mentioned above - drove her to the hospital regardless after she insisted multiple times that she did not want to go and didn't want to risk the embarrassment. At the same time, the officer handcuffed her hurting wrist and still drove her to the hospital where she was forced to, again, refuse treatment. Albeit, this is probably in the officer's procedure that hospital visits are required, but the situation could have been handled much more efficiently.

Overall, we can talk about the victimization this woman experience throughout her whole encounter in the criminal justice system. She was in jail for more than 24 hours simply because no one really cared to do anything about her, and that's the truth.
